Financial Decrees for the Relief of the Reopensie Condition of the Island.

The Supply of Gold and Gold Imports-Important Decrees by the Executive-Spanish Account of the Insurgent Raid Into Nuevitas-Colonial Government and Herald Special Reports-Slave Trade and Landings of Slaves.

HAVANA. August SO, 1878.

The Acting Intendente General, Senor Crespo unitans, who has had a long and varied expeence in public life in Cuba, has signalized his into the highest finance office in this sland by the production of two decrees, which are intended to alleviate the economic condition and financial situation of the island and bring about a reduction of the high rate on goid and a return to specie payments. Both are dated August 28. The est authorizes the free circulation, at its intrinsic value, of gold coin of the South American Republics, and the importation of United States gold, free of duty, while gold exported is to be charged a still further duty of five per cent over that at present marked by the tarif.

THE PREAMBLE of this degree is to the effect that considering the economical crisis which at present compromises all the permanent interests of this territory, urgently demands some kind of measure for its lioration, however partial it may be, and preparatory to the definite resolution of the competent legislative authority, and considering that the naracter of the crisis does not determine its general nature, weighing heavily upon the wealth of he province, but complicates and makes circulation difficult, by reason of the circumstances which bave produced it; that in this sense the crisis is but monetary and its deplorable conequences consist in the withdrawal of gold-the only monetary unit-from circulation in some deants in the island, while in others it freely proulates and abounds, with discredit and depre tiation to the paper circulating medium. Considring that, for certain reasons, a quantity of gold has been exported, which is indispensable to attend to the necessities of the circulation and ublic expenses, and taking into account the imcossibility of importing Spanish gold, which has been in large quantities exported into France and lestined to cover the German indemnity, and considering that lawful money generally abounds in sidering that lawful money generally abounds in excess to the wants of its consumption among the American republics; and considering that the modern concert of nations, the progress of international law has obliterated past animosities, uniting peoples in the closest relations of irlendship and reciprocal aid to carry out the work of civilization y traternal bonds of union, and considering that it is necessary to replace in this market the scarcity of gold for the requirements of the government, and to regulate the unequal and nomalous situation produced by the almost total sappearance of gold in some departments and he depreciation of the circulating currency in others, thereby encouraging speculation bringing on grave and serious dangers, the Acting Intendente has issued the said decree.
